Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Contained in the pages that follow are the amazing stories of what God is doing at Laingsburg United Methodist Church today. As with every other area in our lives, how we spend our money says a lot about who we are, what we value, and speaks volumes to our priorities.

This Narrative budget offers a story and visual description of our life together as a church family, particularly our goals and priorities, and the resources dedicated to achieve them. Together, our time and resources, be they financial or otherwise, facilitate a sacred space for worship, fellowship, discovery, service, and outreach to the world around us.

Their devotion to this project is a reflection of their desire and commitment to making the financial stewardship of Laingsburg UMC more visible to, and understood by, the congregation.

My prayer is that you will find this resource illuminating, offering you deeper insight into your home church. And may God continue to stretch and mature us as we seek to grow in greater generosity and love toward God and one another.

The majority of Laingsburg UMC's revenue comes from three primary sources: Giving Units, Loose Offerings, and Endowments.

Giving Units

This is the church's first and primary source of revenue. Pledge income is the money that members of the congregation commit to giving each year toward the life and ministry of the church. In the last two years, we have begun to shift our giving models and messaging away from dollars and figures toward proportionate giving. Scripture teaches us that spiritually mature giving is that of giving in proportion to one's income—which allows the whole body of the church to share equally in its ministry and mission. Laingsburg UMC's members are encouraged to move toward the 5-10% giving level as a spiritual investment and act of worship. Here is a summary of the income received from our giving units in 2020 and 2021:

Endowment

In 2021, we withdrew \$17,000 from the Palmer Fund. This fund was established and bequeathed to our church by George Palmer many years ago. In years past, we have depended upon this fund to meet our operating expenses for the year. However, the fund cannot be drawn below \$40,000 and the investment has performed dismally in the first quarter of 2022, dropping from roughly \$47,000 to just \$40,000.

Loose Offering

Loose Offering includes those funds received from unidentifiable givers and accounted for 0.7% of our income in 2021.

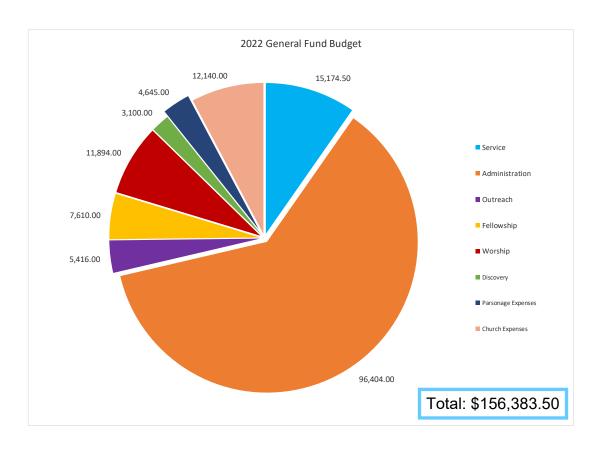
2022 GENERAL OPERATING BUDGET

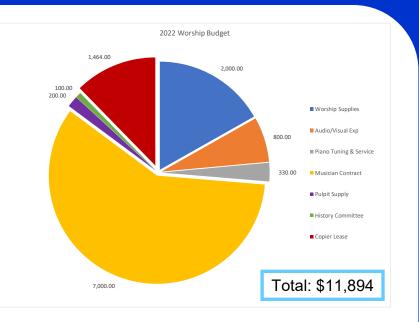


Worship Missional Focus Area

... dedicated to providing you all with a passionate worship experience each week that is engaging for people of all ages.

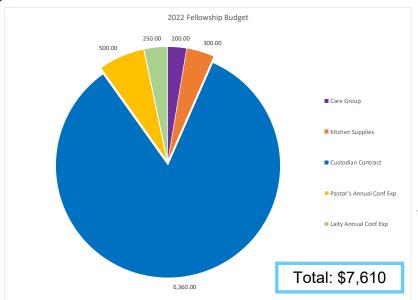
The Worship Team...

- Incorporates the visual aids on the screens.
- Replaced our hearing assistive device earlier this year.
- Assists the Discovery Team with Messy Church planning.

In the year ahead, the Worship Team hopes to...

- Make significant updates to the lighting in the sanctuary.
- Offer a greater variety of music and special music in worship.
- Train more technicians to run the audio and visual enhancements on Sunday mornings, so that a regular rotation can be established.
- Replace our piano, which is malfunctioning, in the coming months.

- Establish a congregational care team to visit with our homebound members.

Outreach is...

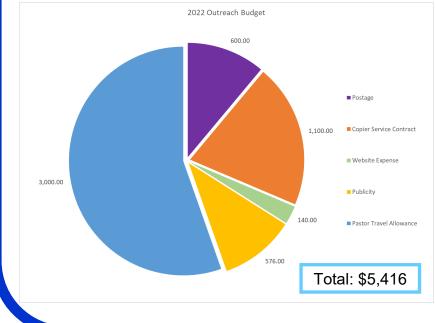

Service is...

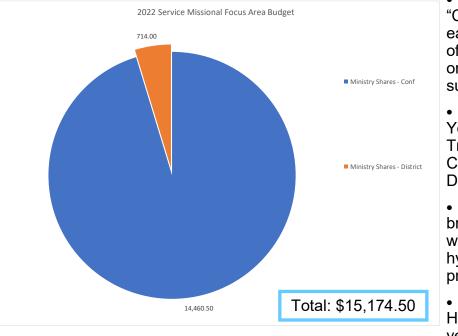

Discovery is...

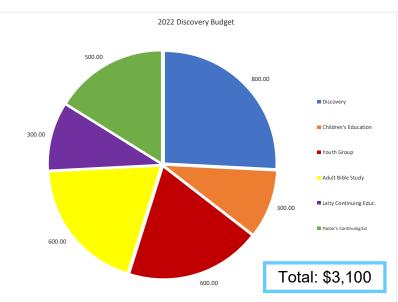
... about participating in, and even sharing with others, enriching and creative opportunities for us to learn more about God, our relationship with God, the world, and with one another.
